- B. Permit Defendant to inspect and copy or photograph all statements, including the substance of any oral statements, of any co-defendants or accomplice as provided in the Alabama Rules of Criminal Procedure, Rule 16.1(b)(1) and (2).
- C. Permit Defendant to inspect and copy or photograph all documents, papers, books, photographs, tangible objects, controlled substances, buildings, places or portions of these things as provided in the Alabama Rules of Criminal Procedure, Rule 16.1(c)(1), (2) and (3).
- D. Permit Defendant to inspect and copy or photograph all results or reports of examinations, tests and experiments as provided in the Alabama Rules of Criminal Procedure, Rule 16.1(d).
- E. Provide Defendant with all exculpatory or otherwise favorable information ass provided in Alabama Rules of Criminal Procedure, Rule 16.1(f) and as provided in such cases as *Brady v. Maryland*, *Giles v. Maryland*, *Giglio v. United States*, *William v. Dutton*, and *Kyles v. Whitely*.
- F. Provide Defendant with such evidence and information that would fall within the guidelines of Rule 404(b) of the Alabama Rules of Evidence.
- G. (Special discovery requests).
